**UC Celebrates Spring
Commencement with Inspiring
Speakers and Honored Graduates**

The University of Charleston proudly celebrated its Spring Commencement ceremonies with an uplifting tribute to the Class of 2025, honoring 382 graduates from its

Charleston, Beckley, and online campuses. The graduates represent UC's five distinguished academic schools: the School of Arts & Sciences, School of Health Sciences, School of Business, School of Leadership, and the School of Pharmacy.

This year's ceremonies featured two keynote speakers: Chef Paul Smith and Brigadier General (Ret.) Michaelle Munger-Dulong. Chef Smith, a trailblazer in the culinary world, recently became West Virginia's first James Beard Award winner. Brigadier General Munger-Dulong made history as the first female general officer in the West Virginia Army National Guard. In recognition of their outstanding achievements and contributions, both received honorary degrees from the university.

Among the many achievements celebrated, UC extends special congratulations to Kelton Graye Boblits, named Undergraduate Senior of the Year, and Matthew Steven Ballard, honored as Graduate Senior of the Year.

The Spring Commencement serves as a powerful moment of pride and promise, celebrating the accomplishments of UC's newest alumni as they take their next steps to lead and serve in communities across the country and the world.



2025 Commencement EDITION



In February 2024, Glenn Kirk visited campus to take part in the annual Give Day festivities. After the trademark bear hugs we've come to expect during his visits, he had a request for us. Although Glenn has remained connected to the university since his days as a Morris Harvey student in the mid 1960s, Glenn's official status was "alum attend," and he wanted to become a recognized alumnus. For Glenn, the title change wasn't about earning a degree—it was about fulfilling a promise he had made to Joyce, his wife of more than 65 years.

“In 1967, my wife was expecting our first daughter at the end of July. One day in early May, we were out walking at the capital, and she suggested we go down the steps and put our feet in the water. We sat there as two young, dumb, happy kids, not knowing what life had ahead of us and we watched the class of 1967 walk out of Riggleman Hall and take the traditional graduation walk to the gymnasium. She looked at me and said, ‘Someday, that’s going to be us.’ I promised her that one day I would graduate.” They both hoped it would be at MHC but that was not in the cards.

“After three years at MHC, I could not afford to stay enrolled. Joyce’s brother-in-law, Philip, worked as a foreman on the line at General Motors and knew we were having financial difficulties paying for college. Philip and Joyce’s sister, Carol, offered to let us live with them in Michigan and Philip could help get me a position at GM.”

So, after he completed his junior year, Glenn and Joyce moved to Michigan.

“I started on the assembly line but moved into the accounting department in the fall of 1968. I went on to become the CFO of General Motors Lansing Car Assembly Operations, a company with an average of \$8.5 billion in sales for GM per year. I had 36 years in with GM when I retired in 2004.”

Along his career path, Glen graduated with an accounting degree from Eastern Michigan University in 1979 and five years later earned his master’s degree from Central Michigan University.

In November 2023, Joyce died after a long battle with Alzheimer’s disease.

“Earning my degree from University of Charleston is the only promise I never kept, and I want to fulfill it.”

Dr. Beth Wolfe, UC EVP of Enrollment Management, started researching and learned that Glenn had enough Morris Harvey College credits to fulfill an associate’s degree in business administration.

Glenn, with four generations of his family members in attendance, walked across the commencement stage on Saturday, April 26th and is officially a member of the Class of 2025.

“I will always be grateful to MHC and the experience that took a kid from Mingo County, WV, who talked funny and slow (they called it Mingonese) and gave me the confidence that I could compete with anybody in the world if I believed in myself.

"My wife and I viewed the campus as hallowed ground. I don’t think there has ever been a time that I was back on campus that I didn’t choke up and get tears in my

eyes. We had a wonderful feeling towards that riverbank, the institution, and the people that changed my life. I am forever grateful for the opportunity to call this place my alma mater.”



MOUNTAIN EAST 2025 HARDMAN AWARD

CHAVON WRIGHT

RUNNING BACK

University of Charleston football player Chavon Wright has won the Hardman Award for Athlete of the Year in the state, as voted by members of the West Virginia Sports Writers Association.

The Hardman Award, called the Amateur Athlete of the Year from

1934-82, is named for A.L. "Shorty" Hardman, who served as sports editor (1936-60) and executive sports editor (1960-78) of the Charleston Gazette.

Wright, a 5-foot-8, 200-pound redshirt junior running back in the 2024 season, was second in the Harlon Hill Trophy balloting, which goes to the Division II National Player of the Year.

"It's an honor (to win the Hardman Award)," Wright said. "When I saw the list of names of people that have received this award in the past, I'm familiar with plenty of them."

The University of Charleston (UC) will be hosting a Health Sciences Bootcamp June 10 – 11, 2025. The camp's purpose is to respond to the ever-growing shortage of healthcare providers in West Virginia. Program goals are to introduce, educate and inspire young students to explore healthcare as a potential career choice while highlighting all UC has to offer.

The camp will focus on students interested in careers such as exercise science, nursing, radiology, occupational therapy, physician assistant, and physical therapy.

Additionally, students will be provided with information to be better informed when selecting the correct coursework to prepare them to pursue a career in healthcare.

The camp will be held June 10th and 11th at the University of Charleston in Charleston, West Virginia. Students will be housed on campus for two days and one night. Students will stay in one of the UC dormitories to provide them with a semblance of dorm life. The camp will also offer hands-on experiences and education to offer students with a “snapshot” of what a day in the life of a healthcare provider may look like.
